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USAID holds ADE graduation ceremony for 107 Students from Sindh

KARACHI: The United States Government, through the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), held a graduation ceremony on Tuesday, for 107 talented students enrolled in the two-year Associate Degree in Education (ADE) in Sindh.
